

## SCHEDULE A – Significant Poutini Ngāi Tahu Waterbodies within the Hokitika FMU

While all waterways are important to Poutini Ngāi Tahu and they have a kaitiakitanga (stewardship) responsibility to protect the mauri of all waterways, they have created this table to provide guidance to those preparing Freshwater Farm Plans about which waterbodies are particularly significant to them within the Hokitika FMU. The tributaries/waterways and drains that feed into these waterbodies are also important for maintaining the water quality in the larger waterways. Please note that this list is not exhaustive. There may be other water bodies in the Hokitika FMU that contain important values. Please check with your local Rūnanga if you are unsure.

An explanation of the Poutini Ngāi Tahu values identified in the Table 1 columns is provided below this table in Table 2.

**TABLE 2: Explanation of the values identified in the Table 1 Columns**

Wāhi tapu	Sacred places; sites, areas and values associated with water bodies that hold spiritual values of importance to Poutini Ngāi Tahu. (Note: Poutini Ngāi Tahu may need to be consulted regarding the location of these places, sites, areas and values.)
Wāhi taonga	Treasured resource; values, sites and resources that are valued and reinforce the special relationship Poutini Ngāi Tahu have with the West Coast's water resources.
Mahinga Kai	Places where food or cultural materials are harvested. Examples of food include eels, whitebait, kanakana (lamprey), kokopu (galaxiid species), koura (freshwater crayfish), freshwater mussels, indigenous waterfowl and watercress. Cultural materials include traditional weaving materials (such as raupō and paru) and rongoā (medicines).
Kohanga	Important nursery/ spawning areas for native fisheries & breeding areas for birds.
Navigation routes	Water bodies which formed part of traditional travel routes.
Waipuna	Spring waters highly regarded for their purity, healing and health-giving powers.
Traditional Campsite	Area or site of either temporary, seasonal or permanent traditional occupation.
Nohoanga	Ngāi Tahu seasonal occupation sites, given contemporary effect through the Ngāi Tahu Claims Settlement Act.
Statutory Ack. Areas	Statutory Acknowledgements areas are in Schedule 5 and are areas of particular significance for Ngāi Tahu.
